

# Kenmore City Council Candidates' Forum

There is a candidates' forum scheduled for Thursday, October 11th, at 7:00 P.M. at the Aqua Club. Eight citizens are on the November ballot for positions on the Kenmore City Council. This is a unique opportunity for Uplake area residents to become better informed about these candidates and to provide input regarding concerns we have in our neighborhood and citywide.

# Fix Up and Clean Up and Remodel

Several homes are sporting new roofs, new paint, decks, repaved driveways, and re-landscaped yards. There are remodeling projects and additions happening also. Keep up all the good work as it helps all of us have an attractive neighborhood.

Unfortunately, there are shrubs and blackberries growing over the edges of some properties. This makes it difficult for walkers and well as being unsightly. Remember the area between your property and the street is your responsibility to maintain.

### Traffic Issues for the Forum

Come to the candidate forum on Oct. 11th and help the UNA board bring traffic issues to the attention of those running for city council. The board is not satisfied with the council's plan to do nothing on the 61st and 181st intersection until the construction work is done in several years on Hwy 522/Bothell Way. In addition, the board is most concerned about the speeding traffic through the neighborhood. Many cars use our neighborhood to bypass congestion on Bothell Way and 61st N. E. Others speed through the area especially down NE 187th and around the curve at Aqua Club and on NE 182nd and through the curve at 60th N.E.

#### Bus Shelter

Many residents use the bus shelter near the 60th N.E. entrance to the neighborhood and have noticed that the garbage receptacle is often overflowing. A call to Metro will notify them of the problem and may encourage them to get a larger container with a lid to keep the crows out!



# Aqua Club Wins SSSL Championship!

Again Aqua Club's swim team has made an impressive showing in the Seattle Summer Swim League by winning 1st place to cap an undefeated season. The strong team "swamped" and "left others in their wake" as they swam to an almost record number of points to capture the trophy for the second time in three years. Aqua Club has 230 swimmers from age 5-18 on the team which is coached by area resident Matt Edwards. Coach Matt especially is proud of the team members for the encouragement and support they give to each other regardless of age.

### A Bit Of History

The Uplake area did not have sewers until the mid 1960's. Prior to that time all homes used septic tanks. The tanks, in most cases, are still in the ground somewhere on the lots. In the early 1960's, in an effort to clean up Lake Washington, many unsewered areas were encouraged to fight the pollution. Uplake's sewers went in about 1966. Pope and Talbot, which had developed the plat, sold off the remaining lots at good prices in order to avoid the sewer assessments. Lake Washington did become clean and swimming in it was no longer banned.
