A Bit of History

Have you ever wondered where the first school in Kenmore was? According to **Priscilla Droge**, children first started school in Kenmore in 1901 in one of the old mill shacks. The first proper school house was built in 1914 and was located next to the current Bethany Baptist Church parking lot on NE 181st St. Unfortunately it was moved in January 2009 and no one knows its current location. If you have heard of where it has gone, let Priscilla know. The school was only used for two years until Kenmore merged with the Bothell School District, Northshore SD.

The first Lake Forest Park School is still standing down at the bottom of the Goat Trail(NE 178th St.). It is the little white office that sits at the "Y" intersection. It was moved to that site after one year at the back of the Wurdemann estate (the big white house you can see from Bothell Way). It served as the local LFP School for two years until a newer school was built on the

Mail Thefts, Break-ins, and Safety Tips

In the last month we have had mail thefts and one major burglary. A home on 58th NE just down from Aqua Club was broken into in the middle of the day. The family wasn't home and a rear window was jimmied. Many valuable items were taken. In this case the owners notified the police and fingerprints were obtained. Other than having an alarm system this type of burglary is hard to prevent. The rest of us need to be vigilant and report any strangers we see around.

Mail has been stolen from boxes on 58th NE and 60th Place NE. Be sure to remove your mail as soon as possible after it is delivered. Better yet get a locking mailbox!

Having the Kenmore Police volunteers check out your home while you are away on vacation is another crime prevention and safety technique. It is easy to do by just stopping at the police station in Kenmore and filling out a form. Also the post office will hold your mail and deliver it all to your front porch on the day you return. You can do this on line by going to the US Postal Service web site or by leaving a note for the mailman.

A Walk Through the Neighborhood

Did you see the beautiful flowing cherry tree in **Palms'** yard on 60thNE? ? Even though we have had a very cold spring and many blooms are delayed, several yard had noteworthy tree displays. Many of the mature flowering trees have interesting trunks and limbs even when dormant. Other beautiful flowering cherries were in the these yards: **Johnson/ Kronheim** and **Laverty/Schmike** yards on NE. 181st, the **Bradley, Chernyak, and Schneider** yards on 60th Place NE and **Newman's** on NE 187th. Beautiful tulip trees (really magnolias) were seen in the **Filer** yard on NE 181st at **Meacham** on 57th NE and **Kabelac/Smith** on NE 182nd. Trees of this size are excellent for neighborhood yards and don't grow to the height of firs, hemlocks, and cedars which are really trees for the forest. Also deciduous trees don't block the sun during our gray winters.
