# Change Comes to Uplake Women's Club

The Uplake Women's Club is going through a metamorphosis. The club, composed of many long time area women, started in 1957 as the Uplake Garden Club. As the women's interests changed in the 1980's from gardening to more social and philanthropic endeavors, the club became the Uplake Women's Club. While still retaining the name, the club is giving up its evening meetings and becoming a luncheon club. Several times a year the ladies will meet at area restaurants to enjoy each other's company and have lunch.

Over the years the UWC has been responsible for much of the beautification of the area. In 1959 the group was instrumental in raising money for the lovely brick entrance on NE 60<sup>th</sup>. They spearheaded the efforts for the plantings and maintenance at the entrances and the signage at the 61<sup>st</sup> entrance. The mailboxes and the visible house numbers were other projects the women undertook. The Women's Club also paid for the fence on the south side of NE 181<sup>st</sup> and planned the annual meeting and potluck dinner held each March. Each December they coordinated placing the lights on the trees at the main entrance. Even currently they made a donation toward the annuals planted at the entrances.

Some of the original members continue to live here in the neighborhood. Priscilla Droge is the only founder of the club still here. Other long time active members are Irene Conrad, Agnes Divoky, Connie O'Neill, Shirley Palm and Fran Owen.

As the UNA takes over many of the projects the Women's Club supported, all of us will gain a new appreciation for their impact on our neighborhood.

## Are You Speeding Through Uplake?

Many complaints have come from the homeowners along NE 182<sup>n</sup>, 60<sup>th</sup> NE and also on 58<sup>th</sup> NE. Are the speeders residents of our neighborhood or are they using the local streets are a shortcut? Remind your family members not to speed in the area. The Lake Forest Park Police have stopped one chronic offender on the "Goat Trail". Local residents are vowing to take down license numbers and report them to the Kenmore Police.

#### Warning About Parked Boats, Cars, Trucks and Trailers

Remember you can't park any vehicles for longer than 24 hours on the parking area in front of your home. Even if you paved the area you still can't have anything parked there for more than one day. The street right of ways in Uplake are very wide. Check to see where your water meter is as it usually is at the front edge of your property. Past that, it is probably city property. Any resident can notify the police and they will post a towing notice on the offending vehicle.

#### Garage Door Opener Issues

Several homes in the neighborhood experienced problems with their garage door openers working sporadically during April and May The problem seems to have gone away for now, however it will probably reoccur and may be permanent.

It seems that the older openers operate on a frequency that is now assigned by the FCC to the federal government. At any time they can be used by the military or government agencies. Five to seven years ago the FCC assigned frequencies 350-400 to the federal government. The older openers (Liftmaster, Genie, Sears) operate at the frequency 390. New openers operate now at the frequency 315. Big thanks go to **Evie Williams** who spent many hours finding the answer to this puzzling problem.
