#### BEWARE of Door-to-Door Sales Persons

Kenmore Police Officer Mark Childers warned us at our October safety meeting that most doorto-door salespersons are not legitimate. Many are casing our properties to see if anyone is at home. To be legitimate, sales persons need to have a City of Kenmore solicitor's license, not just a verbal comment that they have checked with the police.

Many organizations drop off people in our area to sell magazines or solicit donations. An example is the man who was going around the neighborhood in January. He said he was from the United States Mission. This is a group who uses felons who go out in the evening to ask for funds. There was an expose` about the group two years ago on KIROTV <u>http://www.kirotv.com/news/news/homeless-charity-mandates-panhandling-takes-big-cu/nDRg5/</u> They are not a charitable organization, but a religious one. That means their finances are not subject to any state overview.

## Officer Childers says never to hesitate to call 911 even if you think it isn't an emergency. 911 operators screen the calls by asking, "Is this an emergency?"

Is the fact that we are so close to a major highway, that it seems easy for groups to drop their workers/solicitors off here? Maybe if our neighborhood were further away from Hwy 522 they would not come here as often.

## Our Stoplight

Wow! We didn't know that this project was so monumental. At least we will all be safe when we cross 61<sup>st</sup> and there won't be any more T-Bone accidents there. There is still a lot of work to be done as the project was delayed by the rainy weather and the extensive work on the stream on the east side of 61<sup>st</sup>. Thanks again to the City of Kenmore for all of this.

## Bothell Way/522 Plans

As Kenmore moves forward to do more work on Hwy 522 you can learn about the plans by coming to the February 27<sup>th</sup> UNA Board Meeting. The meeting starts at 7:00 PM at Aqua Club. Kris Overlease will discuss the proposed work on the section between 65<sup>th</sup> NE and 61<sup>st</sup> NE. The section from 61<sup>st</sup> NE past our entrance to the west is not included in this work and is a few years in the future.

### Reminder About Long Term Parking



Vehicles, including trailers, can't be parked in the same spot on our streets for more that 24 hours. If you have such a vehicle on your street, you can call 911 to report it. Police will leave a reminder on the car about moving it and if it isn't moved it will be towed. We have even had stolen vehicles abandoned on our streets!!

## Entrance Gardents on 61<sup>st</sup> NE and NE 60<sup>th</sup>

The construction on the stoplight appears to have caused major damage our planting area on 61<sup>st</sup>. After the work is finished we will need to assess how to redo the garden. We also have a repair issue with the lighting on the east side of the NE 60<sup>th</sup> entrance. The board is looking for an answer to the problem that won't cost us too much. The estimate we got was \$2000. We certainly hope we can do it for less. Finally, with the plans going ahead for finishing the construction on Bothell Way from about NE 65<sup>th</sup> to our entrance on NE 60<sup>th</sup> we do have to be vigilant about maintaining our brick entrance and are seeking assurance from the city that it will be kept as is.

### In Memoriam

We had another incident in January when mail was found on the ground and a mailbox was left open. This is another reminder that locking mailboxes and quick removal of mail are the answers to this problem.



## Single Family Home Issues

One of the concerns in many neighborhoods is the ruling by the courts pertaining to the definition of a single family home. In Kenmore and other cities the definition now reads that a home can have up to eight unrelated adults in residence. This has resulted in single family neighborhoods having boarding houses, group homes, and half-way houses. In Uplake, a portion of our area is covered by covenants that say it is a "single family" area. Although that phrase is not defined in the covenants, we believe that while it might not be defined as broadly as Kenmore's definition, there is no way to know for sure until someone pays to litigate it in court.
