


Trader Joe's, a specialty grocery store, is also opening this spring at a location in Shoreline at NE 175th and Aurora.

School Attendance Boundaries for Northshore School District

Beginning in 2017 the Northshore School District has proposed new attendance boundaries for several of its schools. This is driven by the new North Creek High School under construction in the northern part of the district. Northshore is moving to 4-year high schools, grades 6-8 middle schools, and K-5 elementaries.

Fortunately, all of Uplake remains in the present attendance areas. Inglemoor High School will also retain the International Baccalaureate program. Area students will still attend Kenmore Elementary and Kenmore Junior High (soon to be a middle school).

Where are the Speed Bumps?

Neighbors are frustrated that it is taking so long for the City of Kenmore to install the planned speed bumps near Aqua Club. The city has promised that they will do so in the spring, giving the excuse that it wasn't in the 2014 budget and winter is not the time to do asphalt work. King County, who does Kenmore's transportation engineering work, still needs to consult the homeowners closest to the site about the exact location of the speed bumps.
