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## Winter is Coming

The days and nights are getting colder. The wind is starting to blow. We have had one early storm, but more may be coming our way. It's time to check out the flashlights and lanterns and cover the outside faucets. Prepare for winter ahead of time by locating the tire chains and stocking up on deicer.

### Here is a list to help you prepare:

- Fresh batteries for flashlights.
- Recharge any portable lanterns.
- Camp stove or sterno burner to heat food.  
(Don't use in the house)
- Firewood for fireplace
- Plastic to cover broken windows
- Keep prescription medication refilled
- Battery powered radio
- Extra cash
- Canned goods
- Manual can opener
- Keep cell phones charged
- Have one phone that does not require batteries
- Fill car with gas if a storm is forecast
- Extra pet food



Finally check on your neighbors! If you have gas hot water, gas cook top or a gas fireplace, invite neighbors over! Stay off the roads in case of a big snow.

If you are comfortable driving in snowy weather or have a 4 wheel drive car, offer to help our neighbors who may need help getting out and about.

## New Neighbors

More homes have been sold lately and new residents are moving into Uplake.

## August Storm and Power Outage

An unusual summer windstorm took all of us by surprise. Some neighbors were out of power for up to 3 days while others got power back in as little as a day! Uplake is served by power from two or three different sources both through Puget Sound Energy. PSE restores power to the largest number of homes affected first. Only 53 homes were without power for 3 days. That was a small number when the original estimate for PSE outages was 500,000 homes.

Restoration of our power was also an issue a few years ago during the December storm where many of us were out of power for almost a week. It was much worse then as it was COLD too! This reminds us that we need to be prepared for emergencies. Some neighbors are considering talking to PSE about Uplake being at the end of the line during outages.



## Bothell Way/Hwy 522 Construction


The construction on Bothell Way has been an inconvenience this summer. According to the state DOT work is scheduled to move to the south side of Bothell Way during October, as they will be finishing up on the north side. The curvy little part of NE 61<sup>st</sup> down to Log Boom Park will be closed to cars, but bikers and walkers will still be able to access the Burke Gilman Trail until about early November. Access to the trail at 61<sup>st</sup> is unknown after that, until construction is finished.

## Traffic Woes in Uplake

The UNA was successful in getting speed bumps near Aqua Club to slow traffic on that dangerous curve. We are aware that that is not the only concern in our neighborhood. The intersection of NE 182<sup>nd</sup> and 60<sup>th</sup> NE is a place where two accidents happened in recent years. It is a safety issue, being a school bus stop, and cars come around the curve too quickly. More traffic tries to avoid the light at Bothell Way NE 61<sup>st</sup> by cutting through Uplake. They come as far north as NE 190<sup>th</sup>.

Kenmore is planning to add a double left turn lane on Bothell Way at 61<sup>st</sup> and close off the turn lane at 60<sup>th</sup> NE which should cut down on some of the cut through traffic. This probably won't happen for 2 years though.

In the meantime, the City of Kenmore is hosting a meeting regarding traffic problems just in the Uplake area on **Wednesday, Dec. 2 at 7PM** at City Hall. Let's pack the meeting



## RATS, RATS, and MORE RATS

This is an on going problem in many neighborhoods. Uplake is not immune. Keep you bird seed cleaned up, pick up dog droppings, have a tight garbage can lid, and keep vegetable waste in your compost heap covered. Don't feed squirrels, rabbits, or raccoons either. You can also set rat traps. Be very careful using poison as pets and children can be harmed.

If you have a concern about the rats that might be coming from a certain property, you can contact the City of Kenmore using a Citizen Action Report.

## Trees!!!

How can anything as beautiful as a tree cause problems? Well, when neighbors see your tree whipping around in a windstorm and hope it doesn't fall on their home in the dead of night. Or when they paid for view property, and your tree now blocks their view, trees become less beautiful.

Douglas firs, hemlocks, western red cedars, pines, and big leaf maples are really forest trees. They are usually too big for suburban lots because very little can grow under them due to lack of water and too much shade. If you see pictures of Uplake back in 1950's most of these trees are gone because they were logged off. Many of the ones in the neighborhood now have grown up from seedlings. Now they restrict views and are threats during storms. They even send their leaves, cones, and needles into other's yards. Remember those cute little trees grow up to be monsters long after you are gone from Uplake.

Other nuisance trees are cottonwoods, alders, and poplars. These trees really do not fit into the beautiful category! These short-lived trees have brittle branches that leave continual debris around them. Cottonwoods growing along Bothell Way in Lake Forest Park recently have fallen across the highway taking down power lines, one time without the wind even blowing.

If you have any of these trees, and neighbors ask you to trim or cut them down, be neighborly and work with them to do so. When choosing trees for your yard, pick ones at the nursery that stay a reasonable size. Examples are Japanese maples, flowering trees, alpine firs, or vine leaved maples.



## Do We Have Your Email Address?

Of the 220 homes in the Uplake area we have email address for about 170. We send out announcements or emergency warnings about 2-3 times a month. The newsletter comes to you by email also. All mailings are sent out blind copy so no one else sees your address and we never share it with anyone.
