A few years ago the City of Kenmore dropped plans to finish the work on **Bothell Way/Hwy 522 Final Segment** from 61st NE to the edge of Lake Forest Park (all in front of Uplake). Planning has re-started. During the next 2 years the City will work on planning and permitting for the project. The initial plans call for closing off the left turn lane into Uplake but have 2 lanes that turn left onto 61st. This is great news for all those who live near the entrance as they have had a sharp increase in traffic from those wanting to avoid or bypass the traffic signal.
