Emergency Kits

The recent earthquakes around the world remind us to check our emergency kits and update any medications and supplies. Refill your water supplies and replace canned goods. Buy new batteries for radios and flashlights.

Suggested Items for an Emergency Kit

- Three day supply of water (one gallon/person/day) and food
- Flashlights and lanterns with extra fresh batteries
- Portable or hand crank radio
- First Aid Kit
- Wrenches to turn off gas
- Learn how to open garage door if you have an automatic door
- Cell phone with charger
- If a storm is predicted, fill car with gas, as gas stations need power also.
- If you use a generator, keep it outside.
- Use barbeques outside.
- Have frozen bottles of water in freezer to use to keep refrigerator and freezer cold during outage.
- ❖ If the weather is in the 30's, you can store food outside in an ice chest.
- Manual can opener.
- Heavy plastic sheeting to cover broken windows or to wall off rooms to retain heat in a part of the home
- Dust masks, whistles, garbage bags, matches, clean pails
- Prescription medication and glasses
- ❖ Cash
- Sleeping Bags/Tent
- Pet food

Coyotes Seen in Uplake

Coyotes have made an appearance in Uplake this winter. While they were probably always here it has been a few years since they have been seen in the daylight hours. Even the Seattle Times had a feature story about urban coyotes recently. Keep your small animals safe, bring cats in at night, and lock up those chickens! Maybe the coyotes will help with our rabbit population issues.

Rodent Issues

We have mentioned the rat problem before. Remember to keep pet food inside and clean up after dogs. Mice are also a problem. They can get into homes wherever there is a hole about the size of a dime. Plug those with steel wool or caulking. They also can come in through dryer and fan ducts. You can purchase screens, which fit over duct outlets to keep these pests out.
